The Impact of the Newly Implemented Common Core Curriculum on IEP Student Engagement in the General Education Classroom Sheryl Ferguson,2012 This study was designed to analyze the results of a survey given to students receiving academic special education services through an Individualized Education Program at Alexander Doniphan Elementary The purpose of this study was to use to determine the degree to which special education students at Alexander Doniphan Elementary students are engaged in the newly implemented more rigorous Common Core curriculum in the general education classrooms by measuring key indicators of student engagement A review of literature regarding the importance of student engagement on student achievement was undertaken and conclusions and recommendations were made based that research A Chi square analysis was used to analyze the survey responses The findings of this study indicate that overall IEP students continue to enjoy reading and writing lessons in the

newly implemented curriculum though they do not enjoy math lessons Likewise students do feel that they contribute to class activities and projects and that their teachers are satisfied with the work they do in their classrooms but they lack confidence in their ability to understand the work in the new curriculum The study suggests that though IEP students are currently engaged in the newly implemented the administration and faculty should consider further examination of instruction and possible additional support for IEP students
